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Study Guide:

PHASES OF THE MOON DEFINITION

The portion of the moon that we can see from Earth on any given night is called the moon's phase. As the moon orbits around the Earth, sunlight is reflected off the moon's surface and that light reaches us on Earth. The phase of the moon depends on where the moon is in its orbit. It takes about 28 days for the moon to make a full orbit around the Earth, meaning the phases of the moon repeat about once a month!

Mary Musgrove

Mary Musgrove was born in 1700 to a Yamacraw Creek Indian mother and a Carolina trader. Mary's Indian name was Coosaponakeesa. Mary's Creek town was Coweta and was on a well traveled trading pathway. Mary lived with her Creek tribe until her mother died when she was nine years old and she was sent to live with her father. She then became known as Mary and learned to speak English and learned the English ways. Mary's father was a deerskin trader and Mary learned firsthand the trade. Mary spent most of her childhood between the two cultures. In 1717, Mary married an English trader named John Musgrove. Together they set up a trading post near the Savannah River. Mary served as an interpreter and most likely helped attract customers from her Creek relatives. After Mary's husband died, Mary set up a trading camp called Cowpens on Yamacraw bluff. This camp became a major trading center for the English-Indian deerskin trade. While James Oglethorpe was setting up the colony of Savannah, Mary became a go between the English settlers and Creek Indians. She became General Oglethorpe's and Chief Tomochichi's interpreter. During this time, Mary used her connections with her Creek relatives and the English to help promote peace between the two cultures. Later in life, Mary married an English missionary and together they traveled throughout Georgia to mediate between the Creeks and the colonists. Mary died in 1763 on St. Catherine's Island off the coast of Georgia a very wealthy and successful woman.

James Oglethorpe

James Oglethorpe was born in London, England on December 22, 1696. His family was wealthy and so he attended college. Afterwards, he joined the army and fought in a war. Then he returned to England and was elected to Parliament, or the government.

As a young man, he saw a friend of his being put in jail because he had a debt or owed money. While in jail, his friend caught a disease and died. Oglethorpe never forgot his friend and wanted to help others that were put in jail because they could not pay their bills.

In 1732, he was granted permission to start a new colony in the new world, America. King George allowed Oglethorpe to bring 120 settlers and debtors with him to start the new colony in Savannah, Georgia. Soon Oglethorpe made friends with the Indians. Also, he built forts to defend Savannah from the attacks of the Spanish in Florida.

During the next year, Oglethorpe returned to England to live. He married and spent the rest of his life there. Before his death, he realized that the colony he had started became part of the United States of America. After a brief sickness, Oglethorpe died on June 30, 1785.
